Summary points;

- CANdo AGM to be held next meeting, Monday 3rd August, upstairs at the Family Hotel, 5pm-6.30pm
- Place CANdo minutes as downloads onto website. **Action: Karen**
- Can tenby10 Working Party discuss the possibility of reinstating the water allocation to residents of Port Pirie. Even though SA Water has a special exemption in place due to the lead fallout zone, the view is that the additional cost of watering would prohibit the marginalised from utilising it. **Action: forward this suggestion to tenby10 Working Party**
- Can local government assist with subsidising the cost of rainwater tanks in Port Pirie? **Action: forward this suggestion to tenby10 Working Party**
- Ideas for Smelters Picnic (30th Sept) Tenby10 presence at the Nyrstar Marquee: .. Focus on revegetation....
 - Have an area put aside for children to be able to do some 'potting' of trees, to then take home – Port Pirie Garden Club? **Action: Anne Mathews**
 - Contact Arid Lands (Pt Augusta) to see if they can have a stand within the Nyrstar marquee explaining what are the suitable plants/ground cover for our area. Create awareness of the fact that these plants are available for sale at Arid Lands and the services they offer. **Action: Karen**
 - Information on water restrictions for Port Pirie area
 - SA Forestry Commission to see if they could have a truck present at the picnic selling tube stock. (contact Arid Lands first)
 - Profile and promote the CANdo Group at the picnic. **Action: Ali**

Suggestion: Can the 50,000 trees that Wran promised to Port Pirie be offered to local residents? **Action: forward this suggestion to Working Party**

- New Tenby10 Television ads will appear by the end of the year creating further awareness of the tenby10 goal being the end of 2010
- Toilet block at Ellen Street Playground/Flinders View Park – Shortfalls
 - The soap dispenser is removed, why? Did it ever have soap in it?
 - The toilet block (and playground) should be the example of best tenby10 practise
 - Jamestown public toilets are a good example of expected standard, they also have a baby change facility, whereas Pirie offers a stainless steel bench, not very child friendly
 - Suggestion: have '3 year old height' wash basins
 - Suggested that the current lighting is 'dingy', maybe a skylight would brighten the area.

- Suggestions for other ways to target tenby10 messaging to the young, disadvantaged, aboriginal and single pregnant women/partners?
 - It is known that these women/partners are not as likely to attend ante-natal classes, and that the ante-natal classes are more popular with more affluent married couples.
 - Suggestion: Contact Local GP's and Midwives
